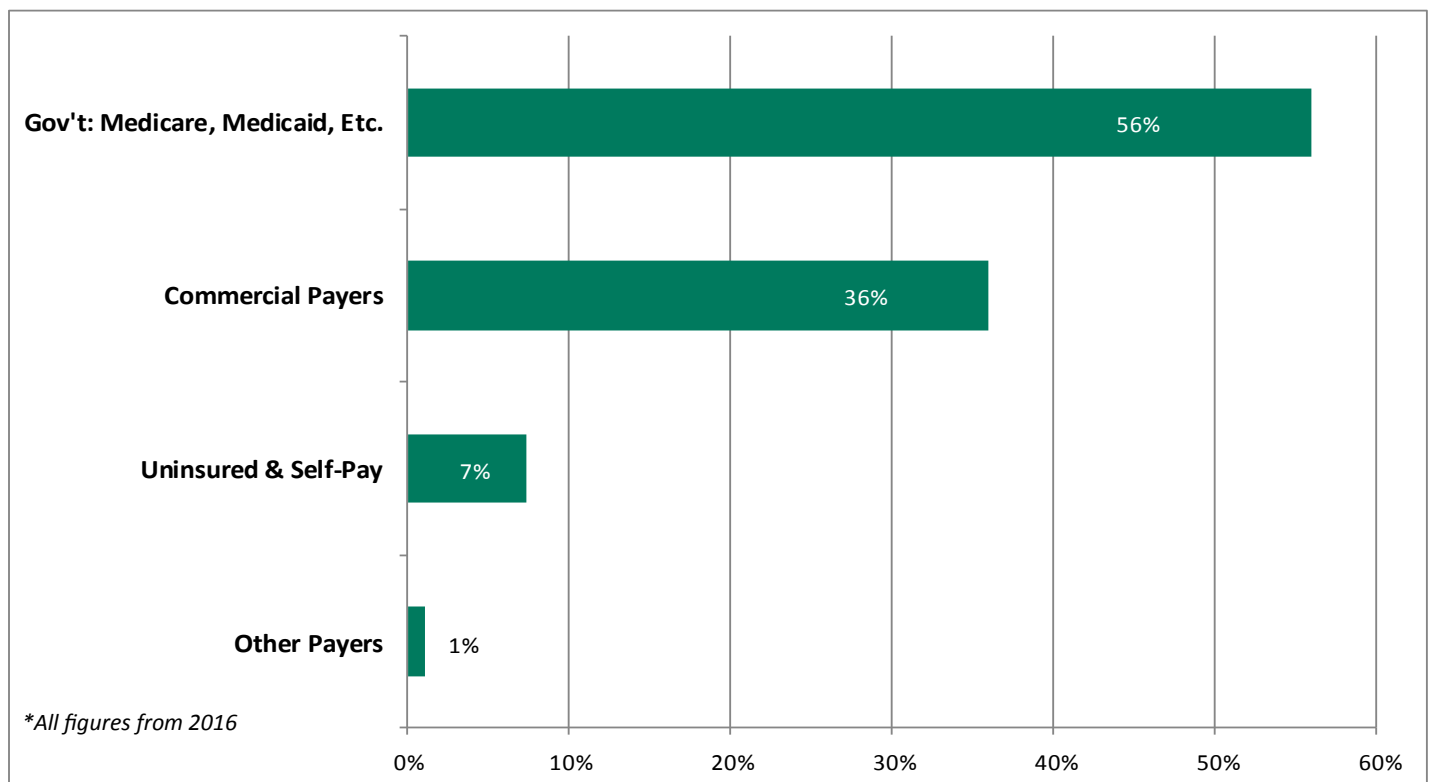


HOSPITAL PATIENT PAYER MIX



Two-thirds of Virginia inpatient hospital admissions involve the uninsured, or those in government-based programs. Hospitals' compensation for that care is less than the actual cost of treatment — pennies on the dollar for government patients, and little to nothing for the uninsured.



On average, **63 percent** of inpatient admissions at Virginia hospitals are people on Medicare, Medicaid, or the uninsured. From 2015-2016, the Medicare shortfall experienced by Virginia hospitals — the shortfall is the difference between reimbursements and actual costs — rose from \$668 million to \$909 million. That's a **36 percent** increase in one year.
